MISSION

To train the next generation of musicians for the church, the community, and the world, for the glory of God

Bachelor of Arts in Sacred Music at Reformation Bible College

Reformation Bible College and Saint Andrew's Conservatory of Music are partnering in the BA in Sacred Music. We have a combined curriculum in Bible and Music over 8 semesters.

BACKGROUND

Why does the Church need this program?

In the current worship and music scene, musicians are often appointed as leaders before adequate preparation: that is, a deep understanding of music, its history, its various components (melody, harmony, texture), and its aesthetic merit. The Church needs musicians who, like Johann Sebastian Bach, are spiritually formed, aesthetically mature, and skilled practitioners of the craft of music.

BASIC CONCEPT

The BA in Sacred Music is a unique curriculum

Our students are gifted potential music leaders in the Church. We include both spiritual formation (theological and doctrinal principles) and practical tools (skill, music literature, administration). Our graduates will have practical training in music ministry. If desired, they may go on to graduate study in music.

PURPOSE

Why does Reformation Bible College want to train future musical leaders?

One element that is missing in many schools of music, despite high standards for technical musical training, is *spiritual wisdom*. That is, the best-trained musicians are today often given the tools for doing music in the Church, but seldom given a solid spiritual grounding, as well as a basis for their aesthetic choices. We believe the BA in Sacred Music provides that balance.

STRUCTURE

How will a BA in Sacred Music work?

Students will be given foundational curriculum: Bible, hermeneutics, doctrine, and theology over 8 semesters, taught by RBC's outstanding faculty. Sacred Music program students will have 60 hours of music preparation classes: music theory, ensemble, applied music lessons, philosophy and administration, hymnology, survey of church music, and a practicum for mentoring in a local church. The music classes will be taught by outstanding adjunct faculty. In addition to classroom work, music opportunities exist for students in the choirs and instrumental ensembles at Saint Andrew's, which is on the campus of RBC. In 8 semesters, a potential church music leader will be trained to begin (or continue) a vibrant music ministry in the local church.

MISSION

What is the potential of the BA in Sacred Music in the 21st Century?

A small army, with God's blessing, of spiritually formed, wise, and skilled practitioners of music for the Church of Jesus Christ. These leaders will create and perform music of profound beauty, which will minister to the hearts inside the Church, and radiate to the surrounding culture.

Certificate in Church Music

Saint Andrew's Conservatory of Music offers the Certificate in Church Music for students or returning adults who do not desire a 4-year degree, want professional certification, or who have a job and want to refresh skills and add new ones. The curriculum is designed to be completed within 2 years (4 semesters) and includes components of private study, skill development, practical management of church music ensembles and programs, and ensemble participation. Courses run concurrently with the Bachelor of Arts in Sacred Music degree through Reformation Bible College.

Applied Music Private study on woodwinds, brass, keyboards, and voice and strings with opportunities to perform each semester.

Musicianship Courses in music theory, conducting, and composition

Music and Worship courses cover historical church music, aesthetic development, and vocational philosophy.

Ensembles include Reformation Chorale, Instrumental Collegium, and handbells.

How long does the program take? Most students will easily fulfill the required courses over 4 semesters

What does the program cost? Students will take a minimum of 6 credit hours per semester.

Cost per credit hour: \$375

Semester lab and supplies fee: \$150

Payment plans are available. Application may be completed online.

What practical experience will students have? Certificate in Church Music students participate in chapel services, and are invited to participate in services at Saint Andrew's, as well as being actively involved in local churches around the Conservatory.

A faculty mentor will be assigned to each Certificate student throughout the program.

REGISTRATION

- Each potential student must complete a registration form (paper or electronic).
- There is a one-time non-refundable \$25 registration fee.
- Advanced students may be required to play a prepared piece, sight-read an unfamiliar piece
 of music, and meet with the individual faculty member to discuss goals before being admitted
 for study.
- Registrations will not be taken over the phone.
- Lessons will not be confirmed for unregistered students.

Returning Students

- In order to receive priority placement, returning students must notify the Conservatory office of their intention to renew prior to the end of the previous semester.
- Registration fees are waived for students who return within one year.

Members of Saint Andrew's Chapel receive a 20% discount.

Tuition

Tuition will be due on or before the first day of lessons. The tuition for a15-week semester will be assessed to all students registering, regardless of what date they begin. Students who pay in full on or before the first day of the semester receive a 10% discount.

A convenient payment plan is available for those who prefer to pay monthly, with an additional \$5 fee per month. Monthly payments are calculated by taking the 15 week tuition and dividing it equally into five monthly payments. (This comes out to three lessons per payment.) Monthly payments do not coincide with the number of lessons given each month.

Faculty members will be unable to accept students after the posted end of registration.

Summer lessons are taught in two four-week terms. Payment in full for the summer session is due on or before the first lesson. (There is no 10% prepayment discount for summer sessions.)

Fees for classes at Reformation Bible College will be announced prior to the start of each semester. Fees for group classes will vary depending on the number of weeks the class runs.

Payment

Payment by credit card, check, or cash must be made at or before the first lesson of the month. Payments received after the 10th of the month will incur a \$15.00 late fee. No lessons will be given to the student until payment has been made.

Students who withdraw after the registration deadline will not receive a refund and will incur a \$25 fee. This policy may be waived by the Dean for extenuating circumstances.

Scholarships

The Conservatory Board of Directors has appointed a Scholarship Committee to consider outstanding students who are recommended by their teacher. Email conservatory@sachapel.com to request an application.

Guitar

Classical guitar students must own or have access to a classical, nylon-stringed guitar. 30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available. No audition is required.

Flute

Students must own or have access to their instrument. 30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available. No audition is required.

Brass

Students must own or have access to their instrument. 30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available. No audition is required.

GROUP INSTRUCTION

Group classes in **music theory**, **violin/string ensemble**, **guitar**, **woodwinds**, **percussion**, or **voice** will be offered if demand is sufficient. Each class runs 8-16 weeks during a term and is open to beginners through advanced students. A minimum number of students must register to guarantee a class.

Music theory instruction is also available privately by special arrangement.

PRIVATE INSTRUCTION

The faculty is committed to upholding the highest standards of musical excellence, using effective teaching methods and the finest curricula available. Our teachers are members of professional organizations such as National Federation of Music Teachers, Music Teachers National Association, Music Educators National Conference, American Guild of Organists, Royal School of Music, and National Association of Teachers of Singing.

30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available to adults and children. Lessons are typically scheduled once a week during the academic year. There are two four-week sessions for private instruction during the summer.

Repertoire Classes are gatherings of students, faculty and parents to allow each student practice performing music learned thoroughly and ready to present. They are not required, but are available for faculty to attend. Dates will be posted each semester with adequate time for students to prepare music for the class.

A parent or legal guardian must be present in the classroom during any private lesson given to a child under 18 years of age.

Piano

Students are required to own or have access to a well-tuned acoustic piano on which to practice during the week. 30, 45 or 60-minute lessons are available. No audition is required.

Organ

Students are required to have access to an organ on which to practice during the week, which may include scheduled time on one of the Conservatory's organs. 30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available. Piano experience is necessary before beginning organ, and an audition with the instructor is required.

Harpsichord

the instructor is required.

Students are required to have access to a harpsichord on which to practice during the week, which may include scheduled time on the Conservatory's harpsichord. 30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available. Piano experience is necessary before beginning harpsichord, and an audition with

Voice

30, 45 or 60-minute lessons are available. Some instructors require an audition.

Violin

Students are required to own or have access to an appropriately-sized violin. 30, 45, or 60-minute lessons are available. New students must schedule a meeting with instructor prior to beginning study.

POLICIES

Child Safety

Supervision

During lessons with minor children (students under 18), at least one adult (18+) in addition to the teacher must remain with the child throughout the time scheduled. There will be no exceptions to this policy, which applies to all Saint Andrew's Chapel events.

Siblings/Guests

During lessons where multiple-child families are present, children must be supervised by an adult at all times.

Attendance

Students who are late for a lesson will not be guaranteed their full lesson time.

Once you have registered for a class or private lesson, you are responsible for notifying the instructor if you will be absent.

Excused Absence

One excused absence is allowed each term. Notice must be given to the instructor at least 24 hours in advance.

The term schedule includes a week of make-up lessons at the end of each term. Additional absences may be excused, but it is up to the discretion of the instructor to schedule additional make-up lessons. Refunds will not be issued.

Unexcused Absence

Cancellation on day of lesson may be necessary in some cases. This unexcused absence will be made up at the discretion of the instructor. Instructors are not required to make up any unexcused absence.

Teacher Absence

If a teacher misses a lesson, the teacher has until the end of the semester to make up a teacher absence. (Monthly lesson payments will not be adjusted.) If by the end of the semester the teacher has not been able to make up their absence(s), the student will be refunded for the teacher's missed lesson(s).

Withdrawal

Withdrawal requests must be made in writing (includes email).

A \$25 fee will be collected for any withdrawal.

Week 1 - 3	Refund 100% of tuition balance
Week 4 - 6	Refund 75% of tuition balance
Week 7 – 15	Refund 50% of tuition balance

Tuition balance is defined as tuition remaining for lessons not taken.

Facilities Maintenance

• Do not allow children to run in the sanctuary or play with worship items/supplies.

Recital Etiquette

- Students must be appropriately dressed for a formal recital. Their dress should reflect the high standards the Conservatory upholds. Casual clothing should be avoided.
- Students will sit together in the front rows. In cases of very young children, sitting with parents is allowed. Please make sure your child is close enough to the front to approach the stage quickly.
- Students should remain until the completion of the recital.
- Students must sit quietly throughout the recital and listen attentively to other students as they perform.
- Instructors will train their students in correct etiquette for approaching and leaving their instrument and receiving applause.
- Students are encouraged to perform their pieces by memory if possible.

Music Copying

Copying copyrighted music is illegal.

- While copyrights vary by publishing year, in general any music written or published after 1923 is likely still under copyright.
- Even when older music is in the public domain, the sheet music itself, if created by a publisher after 1923, is *not* unless specified by its publisher.
- Since 1989 the © symbol/information has been optional, so even if you do not see copyright information printed on the music it may still be under copyright.
- Music no longer in print is likely still under copyright, but express written permission by the publisher to copy out-of-print music may be obtained.

Faculty and students of Saint Andrew's Conservatory will **not be permitted to make or use copies of copyrighted music** unless express written permission of the publisher allows them to make a temporary copy until purchased music arrives (at which time the copy must be destroyed).

The facilities of Saint Andrew's Chapel will not be made available for students wishing to copy music. Faculty may copy proven non-copyrighted music with the assistance of staff.

Copies or excerpts with sources properly cited may be made in compliance with "fair use" laws (Title 17, Section 107, U.S. Code)—that is, short excerpts or exhibits in an academic paper, speech, article, classroom demonstration, or similar.
